Mr Hanan from Unigreen came to speak to Eco Club about how we can use bamboo over trees as a natural resource. We looked at the impact of using trees over bamboo (they take 1 year to grow, trees take 38 years), bamboo doesn't need any chemicals mixed in, they use natural colouring from plants. We completed 2 science investigations - 1 using a McDonalds straw compared to a bamboo straw to see which would last longer and then how quick and easy it is to break down the bamboo products using only water.

Absence and Lateness



The School day begins at 8:55am. Gates are opened ten minutes earlier at 8.45am when children are welcomed in by a leader at the gate. After gates have shut at 8:55am, we frequently have a number of children arriving after school has officially begun. When children arrive late they are missing out on morning learning opportunities. Please ensure that your child is on time every day.

If you do arrive late with your child, you need to accompany them to the front office and sign them in on the touch screen 'inventory' system.

Please do everything you can to avoid taking children out of school as this comes at a cost to your child's education. Please see our attendance policy on the website for information regarding penalty notices which will be issued if a pupil has had 5 school days (10 sessions) lost to unauthorised absence during the current term or 7 school days (14 sessions) in 2 consecutive terms. A holiday form must also be completed at least **2 weeks prior** to the start of the absence to avoid a penalty notice being issued.

School Uniform and PE Kit

This is a polite reminder about the details of our school uniform policy, specifically PE kit and jewellery. Skins are not part of the school PE kit. If you feel your child needs additional layers, these can then be worn discreetly underneath the correct kit of long pants and jumper at this time of year.

Our PE Uniform

Children are asked to come into school on the day of their PE lesson wearing their PE kit. They can wear it for the full school day.

Parents/carers are responsible for ensuring their child is dressed appropriately for PE.

The PE kit is as follows:

- Blue PE T shirt with logo
- **Plain navy** zipped hoody or sweatshirt
- **Navy tracksuit** bottoms or leggings (Autumn/Winter)
- **Navy shorts** (Spring/ Summer)
- Plain, suitable trainers or black pumps

Jewellery

Jewellery is not allowed with the exception of small, plain, stud earrings (not hoops or huggies) and a sensible watch. (No smart watches)

All jewellery must be removed during practical lessons, for example, PE lessons / swimming lessons.

If children cannot remove their own earrings, then this should be done at home on the day of PE.

Weekly Highlights

Nursery & Reception Little Lennies' & Blackbirds



This week in Early Years, we have been exploring The Festival of Light, Diwali. The children have been getting creative, looking at the beautiful, colourful designs seen in rangoli artwork. The children have explored these patterns using finger painting skills, loose-part artwork and painting whilst listening to traditional Hindu music. We have enjoyed learning about the culture of Hinduism and the ways that Diwali is celebrated - discussing the similarities and differences to other faith celebrations.

Year 1 & 2 Doves, Eagles & Falcons



Key Stage 1 has been working hard as always but have shown true perseverance this week. This attitude had allowed them to design and construct their own windmills with a moving turbine! This week we have continued to read 'Nibbles' as part of our English lessons looking at how other well-known stories would have changed if he took a chunk out of our favourite books. In Geography, we started to learn all about the countries which make up the United Kingdom and explored the facts we can derive from an atlas. In PE we have had a lot of fun demonstrating our skills of travelling, jumping, rolling, and balancing on the apparatus. Well done everyone!

Year 3 & 4 Herons, Kingfishers & Owls



What another busy week we have had in Lower Key Stage 2. The children have enjoyed reading more of 'Winter's Child' and the novel accompanying it, 'The Ice Palace.' They have been looking closely at vocabulary and the meanings of some unfamiliar words. In Geography we have been looking at different maps and learning to point out different features, including human and physical. In French the children enjoyed playing snap games whilst learning how to say and write the names of different animals! Everyone is very excited for the book fair visiting and the brilliant variety of books to buy! Well done everyone on lots of hard work this week.

Year 5

This week was filled with plenty of brilliant learning! In Geography, we learnt all about the different biomes on our planet. In Science, we explored how the rotation of the Earth creates day and night. In RE, we continued our learning on the different views of the importance of Mary. We finished our week with a fun Key PE session and started creating our Doodlers in DT. Well done Year 5!

Year 6

This week, Year 6 have been writing hybrid texts based on an animal of their choice - they have enjoyed finding out interesting facts about their animal. In Maths we have been multiplying and dividing fractions and the children have really impressed us with their hard work. In Geography, the children have learned how the Lake District was formed and the movement of tectonic plates over billions of years whilst in Science, children used mirrors to see objects behind them and explained how this is possible due to the reflection of light. A very busy week for all ! Well done year 6.




