NPSCC



In December, children will be participating in the NSPCC Speak Out Stay Safe programme.

Speak out. Stay safe. is a programme for children aged 5-11 which aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a safe adult or Childline.

This child friendly programme is aligned with the curriculum and consists of age appropriate virtual assemblies and supporting classroom based activities which we have reviewed, alongside NSPCC volunteer led face to face workshops for children aged 6-7 and 9-11. Absence and Lateness



The School day begins at 8:55am. Gates are opened ten minutes earlier at 8.45am when children are welcomed in by a leader at the gate. After gates have shut at 8:55am, we frequently have a number of children arriving after school has officially begun. When children arrive late they are missing out on morning learning opportunities. Please ensure that your child is on time every day. If you do arrive late with your child, you need to accompany them to the front office and sign

them in on the touch screen 'inventry' system.

Please do everything you can to avoid taking children out of school as this comes at a cost to your child's education. Please see our attendance policy on the website for information regarding penalty notices which will be issued if a pupil has had 5 school days (10 sessions) lost to unauthorised absence during the current term or 7 school days (14 sessions) in 2 consecutive terms. A holiday form must also be completed at least **2 weeks prior** to the start of the absence to avoid a penalty notice being issued.

Weekly Highlights

Nursery & Reception Little Lennies' & Blackbirds





Little Lennie's explored light and dark this week, looking at primary and secondary colours. The children also explored how we can see light and colours through our eyes, why we can't see as well in the dark and how torches can help us. Little Lennie's took advantage of the beautiful morning sun this week and created their own shadows on the playground.

This week, Blackbirds have been learning about how rainbows are formed from the white light of the sun, shining down on rain droplets and this white light bouncing off and dispersing into the seven colours of the rainbow. The children have been experimenting with colour mixing, revisiting primary colours and secondary colours and extending this learning to an investigative enquiry with colour spinners.

Year 1 & 2 Doves, Eagles & Falcons







Key Stage 1 children have had a fabulous week and enjoyed exploring the frost on the playground and it has been great to hear some scientific conversations about the frosted leaves on the floor. This week we have continued to read 'Nibbles' as part of our English lessons and have been writing our own diary entries as Nibbles causing mayhem in the stories. In Geography, we started to learn all about the countries which make up the United Kingdom and explored their capital cities. In PE we have had a lot of fun demonstrating our skills of travelling, jumping, rolling, and balancing on the apparatus. We are still working hard on creating our windmills, getting ready to test them next week. Well done everyone!

Year 3 & 4 Herons, Kingfishers & Owls







It's been another busy week in Lower Key Stage 2. We have been looking at maps of our local area in Geography, identifying our school, and the human and physical features we can see locally. In Science, it has been interesting learning all about the different parts of the skeleton and their functions. In English we have read more of 'Winter's Child' and have enjoyed creating similes based on the text and letters written from one character to another. In DT we are learning about eating seasonally and have planned to make tarts made from seasonal ingredients. The children are very excited today to see school decorated for Christmas! Well done everyone on all of your hard work.

Year 5


We have enjoyed another fun-filled week in Year 5! In Geography, we continued our learning about biomes and looked at how they change across the world. In Science, we explored the interesting reasons as to why and how we have different seasons. In RE, we looked at chapter 2 of Matthew's Gospel and learnt about the significance of the flight to Egypt. We finished our week with an enjoyable Key PE session and continued working on creating our Doodlers in DT. Well done Year 5!

Year 6

This week the children have been very engaged with our new writing topic about the Christmas Truce in World War One. This has extended the children's knowledge of World War One which they have enjoyed learning about not only in History, but also through our guided reading novel - 'The Armistice Runner'. In Geography the children learned about the Tatra mountains in Poland and considered the physical geography of the region as well as the similarities and differences between Poland and England. In RE, we have continued our work on Advent and how the Church prepares for Christ during this important season. Preparations have been continuing for our carol concert at Blackburn Cathedral and the children are singing beautifully. Well done Y6!


