NSPCC



In December, children will be participating in the NSPCC Speak Out Stay Safe programme.

Speak out. Stay safe. is a programme for children aged 5-11 which aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a safe adult or Childline.

This child friendly programme is aligned with the curriculum and consists of age appropriate virtual assemblies and supporting classroom based activities which we have reviewed, alongside NSPCC volunteer led face to face workshops for children aged 6-7 and 9-11. The content is delivered in an engaging and interactive way with the help of the NSPCC mascot Buddy. If you would like to know more about the *Speak out. Cold Weather

Please remember to send children in with waterproof winter coats everyday, and hats and gloves as the weather turns cold. If your child needs to use lip balm due to dry skin in the cold weather, this is permitted before school and at break times, not during lessons. Please remind your child that lip balm is not to be shared. Labelling of lip balms in case they get lost will help with a swift return. Absence and Lateness



The School day begins at 8:55am. Gates are opened ten minutes earlier at 8.45am when children are welcomed in by a leader at the gate. After gates have shut at 8:55am, we frequently have a number of children arriving after school has officially begun. When children arrive late they are missing out on morning learning opportunities. Please ensure that your child is on time every day.

If you do arrive late with your child, you need to accompany them to the front office and sign them in on the touch screen 'inventory' system.

Please do everything you can to avoid taking children out of school as this comes at a cost to your child's education. Please see our attendance policy on the website for information regarding penalty notices which will be issued if a pupil has had 5 school days (10 sessions) lost to unauthorised absence during the current term or 7 school days (14 sessions) in 2 consecutive terms. A holiday form must also be completed at least **2 weeks prior** to the start of the absence to avoid a penalty notice being issued.

Weekly Highlights

Nursery & Reception Little Lennies' & Blackbirds



Focussing on expressive arts and design this week, Blackbirds have been exploring bridges. After reading the story 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff', the children explored beam, truss and suspension bridges thinking about how each of these are made to be strong and sturdy. After initial exploring and planning, the children had a go at making their own bridges out of paper, cardboard and various other materials found in the classroom, using a range of techniques - some bridges collapsed and some were strong. The children evaluated their bridges and thought of different ways to make their bridges even better!

Little Lennies have been thinking about the habitat of hedgehogs. The children made their own clay hedgehog using fine motor skills and created a habitat box for their hedgehog to live in, making sure they have enough autumn leaves to keep them warm. Little Lennies have also thought about what they use to keep themselves warm during our cold winter months - hats, scarves, gloves, wellies, warm boots and earmuffs!

Year 1 & 2 Doves, Eagles & Falcons



Key Stage 1 have had a brilliant week and we couldn't be more proud of their determination and perseverance during their assessment week. In Geography, we started to learn all about the seas and oceans which surround the United Kingdom and explored more of their capital cities. In PE we have had a lot of fun creating our own gymnastics routine with our partners. This week we are still working hard on creating our windmills and we even tested some to find they worked! Well done everyone!

Year 3 & 4 Herons, Kingfishers & Owls



There's been a lot of hard work in Lower Key Stage 2 this week whilst completing our Autumn assessments. Well done everyone on your wonderful behaviour and attitude. In Geography we have continued to study maps, and we are becoming experts at identifying human and physical features. In Science we are enjoying learning about skeletons and how they function. 
