Weekly Highlights

Nursery & Reception Little Lennies' & Blackbirds



This week our early years children have made a fantastic start to 2024! They have been keen and eager to learn after the Christmas break. In Nursery the children have been learning from the story of 'The Lost Coin' and in Reception 'The Lost Sheep.' We have been thinking about what we can learn from stories, especially ones that happened so long ago. Our learning has developed our understanding of using positional language and recognising what perseverance is. We have been on treasure hunts and looked carefully for things, just like the characters in this week's stories. Lots of counting and fun playing together has resulted in a wonderful week. Well done everyone!

Year 1 & 2 Doves, Eagles & Falcons



Key stage one have had a great week back beginning lots of new learning. In RE, we created a piece of art about special friends ready for our unit on What Made Jesus special. We looked at things such as timing and patterns that help us in PE with dance. Everyone enjoyed using the bee bots in Computing and we used circles in our abstract art. We learned about what started the Great Fire of London in 1666. Finally, our new Science work about materials was very exciting with some of us discovering that eggs are actually strong enough to hold a whole pile of books before they break. What a busy week back!

Year 3 & 4 Herons, Kingfishers & Owls



Lower Key Stage 2 have had a very exciting return to school after the break! We have started to look at two great new books which we will be using this half term. We have been able to use all the knowledge we learnt in our last History topic with our new writing book, 'Stone Age Boy'. In our Reading lessons, we have made predictions and began to read our new novel, 'Ice Palace'. In History we are learning about the 150th anniversary of our school, and what the Victorian times were like when the school was built. In PE we have been practising our dancing, working in groups to create a routine. In Science we have learnt about how different animals are classified, specifically looking at vertebrates and invertebrates. Well done everyone!

Year 5 & 6 Robins, Swifts & Wrens



Year 5

We have had a great first week in the Spring Term and have started lots of new and exciting units of learning. In Guided Reading, we have been introduced to Shakespeare's '*Macbeth*' and have learned more about the playwright himself. In English, we have had a go at writing our own myths before we start reading '*Arthur and the Golden Rope*'. We have started to choreograph a spooky dance in PE and Swifts enjoyed their first swimming session. In Spanish, we learned new vocabulary to describe where we live and in Art, we learned about Banksy and adapted one of his famous murals. In History, we started to learn about the Ancient Mayan Civilisation while in Science, we identified and described properties of different materials, evaluating their usefulness. In RE, we considered what makes Jesus a great teacher. A fantastic start to the new term, well done Year 5!

Year 6

It has been lovely to welcome the children back into school after Christmas. We have started our new writing unit based on the story of the 'Selfish Giant' and our new class novel - 'Who Let the Gods Out' by Maz Evans - both of which they have enjoyed. In Science, the children learned about blood as part of our new unit of work on the circulation system and found out what blood is made of and what it does. In History, we learned about William the Conqueror and the legacy that he left behind and in RE, we have learned about the Exodus story. It has been a busy week and the children have worked very hard - well done Year 6 !
