Weekly Highlights

Nursery & Reception Little Lennies' & Blackbirds



This week in early years we have focused on developing our artistic talents. In Nursery the children have used the traditional tale 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' to talk about our own families and using our manners. The children have looked at the technique of collage and had fun developing their scissor skills. In Reception, the children read the story of 'Goldilocks and Just the One Bear.' This provided a great opportunity for them to compare this story with the traditional tale, noticing similarities and differences. The children have extended their understanding of ways to attach - using split-pins, slots, treasury tags, clips, glue and Sellotape. Learning more about healthy eating stemming from porridge and the importance of breakfasts also supported the children's thinking. What a super week everyone! 🍌

Year 1 & 2 Doves, Eagles & Falcons



This week, Key Stage 1 have continued to show a great interest in their learning (including learning about learning). They have shown good knowledge about the Great Fire of London as we continued to look at what happened next when the wind changed. In computing, they used the Bee-Bots and predicted where it would end up if a sequence of buttons (instructions) were to be given. They followed a pattern and timing to perform some dance moves of the theme of Spring (To the tune of 'When I Grow Up') or Summer ('Walking on Sunshine'). In Art, they enjoyed lines and mark making to draw water and listened and responded to different stories of some of the miracles of Jesus. Along with their maths, English and guided reading, there have been many good efforts to move forwards with their learning. Well done.

Year 3 & 4 Herons, Kingfishers & Owls



Well done on another great week of learning Lower Key Stage 2! In our Whole Class Reading lessons we have started to read 'Hidden Figures' by Margot Lee Shetterly. We have discussed the discrimination and segregation that the ladies would have faced, and how different their lives were compared to ours today. In Art we have manipulated wire into different shapes to create an outline of a fish. In History we have continued to learn about the history of our school, comparing what Victorian schools were like compared to modern day schools! In RE we have discussed the story of Zacchaeus and how meeting Jesus dramatically changed his life, even though it wasn't a straightforward decision for him to make. Well done everybody!

Year 5 & 6 Robins, Swifts, Wagtails & Wrens



Year 5

This week in Year 5, we have finished reading 'Macbeth' and considered the key themes of the story, which we can now compare to 'Hamlet' as we start another of Shakespeare's tragedies. We have reflected a lot on what 'learning' is and how we can ensure we learn in every lesson. In Art, we considered how symbols and images have been used to communicate through history and how this is still used today. In PE, the children have been extending their sequences and learning new dances in character. In History, we learned what the Maya invented and how they have been adapted for modern life. In Science, we practised four methods of separating mixtures and solutions and reflected on how these are used on a larger scale in real life. In RE, we read the 'Beatitudes' from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount and thought about how we can live these out to follow in Jesus' footsteps.

Year 6

The week the children have continued to enjoy 'Who let the Gods Out' and have been exploring some of the vocabulary that the author has used. In writing, the children composed a Newspaper report based around the Selfish Giant story - reporting on a missing boy and we are looking forward to writing our full narrative story next week. In History, the children were interested to learn about Elizabeth the First and in RE, we learned about the Passover and the significance to the Jewish people. PE this half term is all about skill and agility and it has been super to see so many skilful and agile Year 6s in the hall ! Well done year 6 - keep up the great work.
