The children thought very carefully and asked some excellent questions. A huge thank you to the fire service and also to Nicola and Shamas from North West Ambulance Service for helping the children develop their understanding of the vital role our ambulance crews play in helping everyone to keep safe and well too. Weekly Highlights

Nursery & Reception Little Lennies' & Blackbirds



What a fabulous week of learning we have had in Early Years! We have been thinking about 'people who help us' and people who are skilled at 'rescues'. We have been incredibly lucky to have been visited by the emergency services - firefighters and paramedics - who taught us all about keeping ourselves safe. This linked perfectly with our first pupil promise. We learnt all about the importance of a smoke alarm, a safe bedtime routine (shutting our doors) and what to do in the event of a house fire (stop, drop and roll!). We saw and learnt all about the equipment in both emergency service vehicles and even heard the sirens! We also had a visit from our lollipop lady who helped us think about ways we can keep safe when crossing the road - stop, look and listen! She told us all about her very important role. PCSOs taught us how we can keep safe if we ever get lost from our caregivers and how they help take care of people in our community. Dr. Watson also visited us and we got to learn all about the insides of our bodies, how doctors help us when we are unwell and how we can help keep our bodies healthy by washing the 'glitter germs' off our hands. We got to take on the role of being Doctors, testing bodily fluids (juice and chocolate sauce!) and looking after our poorly teddy bears - bandaging them up, listening to their hearts and looking inside their mouths. We also explored water safety - why we need water but how water can also be dangerous and ways we can keep ourselves safe. A super week of learning important life skills!

Year 1 & 2 Doves, Eagles & Falcons



It has been lovely to welcome all the children back to school this week and they have been eager to start the new term. Our week started with a visit from the emergency services and it was great fun exploring the different vehicles. In English, we explored different bones and started to explore our new book, 'The Curious Case of the Missing Mammoth'. In science, we have identified the parts of a plant and thought carefully about the important job each part does. In PE, we have enjoyed team games and worked together to collect as many cones as possible. A super week for everyone, well done!

Year 3 & 4 Herons, Kingfishers & Owls



It's been an exciting first week of the half term which started with a visit from Lancashire Fire and Rescue. The children learned about fire risks and awareness of what to do in the event of a fire. They had a look inside a fire engine and the equipment the Lancashire Fire and Rescue use. In Guided Reading we have started reading 'The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe' and the children are excited and engaged with this text, asking lots of interesting questions and making links between past texts. In English this week we have written a recount and a letter using two texts with Whale themes. We are gathering and practising skills for our final outcome of an 'Information Article' about the protection of the blue whale. In RE we looked at the definition of trust and the connection to loyalty and reliability as we commenced our unit on 'Easter, a story of trust and betrayal'. In Science we discovered the parts and functions of flowering plants and in Geography we learned about countries, capital cities and regions in the UK. What an interesting week!

Year 5 & 6 Robins, Swifts, Wagtails & Wrens



Year 5

It has been lovely to see everybody again in Year 5 after half term - we got straight on with lots of exciting learning. In Spanish, we started our new unit on 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears,' where we were able to learn some more new words. In Science, we started looking at the human timeline and found it fascinating to discover how a new life develops in the womb. In RE, we started our new unit on Easter and looked specifically at why Christians believe Easter is a celebration of victory. Robins loved their first swimming lesson and Swifts enjoyed their Key PE session at the end of the week. What a fun-filled first week back!

Year 6

It has been lovely to see the children back for the second half of their final year at primary school! We have started our new class novel - 'Wonder' by R.J.Palacio - which is a very different book to those which we have read before. The children are enjoying the story so far. Our new writing unit is based on the beautifully illustrated book 'Island' by Jason Chin - this unit will end with the children writing an explanation report based on the Galapagos Islands. We have continued our work on the circulatory system in Science and in Geography have begun our unit of work on Earthquakes, Volcanoes and Mountains - very interesting indeed! A super start to this half term - well done everyone.
