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Worship





Weekly Highlights

Nursery & Reception Little Lennies' & Blackbirds





This week in Early Years we have been reading the stories of 'The Gingerbread Man' and 'Loaves and Fishes.'

In Nursery we baked gingerbread men and had a hunt because they all ran away! We enjoyed looking at shape collage Gingerbread Men using different shapes for eyes and buttons. We have also painted Easter egg decorations with different patterns.

In Reception we have developed our design and technology skills - designing and creating our own bead buns. We linked these to our Bible story and enjoyed sharing food and stories together. We have also practised our fine motor skills, progressing from weaving to threading our own patterns to create beautiful bookmarks. Well done everyone on a superb week of learning!

Year 1 & 2 Doves, Eagles & Falcons







Everyone has worked incredibly hard again and the week has flown by! In Science, we considered the difference between types of trees and explored how seeds are spread. In geography we located the tropical areas of the world and discovered some interesting facts about rainforests around the world, concentrating on the Amazon Rainforest. During English, we looked at the importance of rhyme in poetry and enjoyed exploring the Natural History Museum to help us prepare to write our own poem called 'The Empty Museum'. We discussed the various symbols that represent Easter and focused on the reason behind the Paschal Candle during RE and thoroughly enjoyed listening to our worship leaders explain all about Holy Week. A big well done to all our children!

Year 3 & 4 Herons, Kingfishers & Owls







It has been a fabulously exciting week! As we approach Palm Sunday and Good Friday, we have been considering the betrayal of Jesus by Peter. We hot seated 'Peter' and asked many interesting questions using religious vocabulary. Additionally we considered whether Peter's betrayal was the same or different to Judas's betrayal. The children made palm leaves and wrote on prayers of thanks, prayers to say sorry and prayers to ask for help. They also made 'I am grateful for' leaves for the display in the school reception area. In English, the children have started their shared writing of a persuasive article which they are enjoying. I have seen some interesting information in these articles along with fabulous features of

language, grammar and presentation for this genre. Our WCGR has generated excellent discussion as we come towards the end of the Lion, Witch and the Wardrobe. We discussed themes of good over evil and character representation with links to Christianity. We continued to make and decorate Echarms to hold a microbit and the children will complete and test them in the final week of term. PE was enjoyed by all with everyone achieving and being encouraged by their teams. An excellent week for all!

Year 5

We have enjoyed another busy, yet brilliant, week in Year 5! In Spanish, we finished off our own storyboards to rewrite Goldilocks and the Three Bears, adding some illustrations - they look great. In Science, we found it very interesting to learn about the different lengths of gestation periods for different animals. In Geography, we used Digimaps to explore the latitude and longitude of different landmarks all around the world. We also spent some time making special palm leaves, which we used for Robins' class worship in church on Friday. What a brilliant week!

Year 6

This week in Year 6, the children have continued to produce excellent pieces of written work based on the short film 'Alma' - it certainly seems to have captured their imaginations! In Science, the children learned about the function of the kidneys in cleaning and filtering our blood and in Geography, we learned about the formation of mountains due to the movement of tectonic plates. In RE the children learned what Jesus said about himself and wrote some wonderful sentences describing themselves. The children have also enjoyed PE this week - especially our invasion games. Well done year 6!
