Nursery & Reception Little Lennies' & Blackbirds



This week in Early Years our Nursery children have enjoyed the story of 'Zog.' They have had great fun finding out about St George, making flags and painting dragons. The children also created their own shields, talking about themselves as they did so. Our Reception children have listened to the story of 'Zog and the Flying Doctors.' We have linked being brave and our prior knowledge of medicines and people who help us to stories of old - learning about St George. We also found out about the work of Marie Curie. Our art skills have been developed as we created our own chalked dragon pictures. On Wednesday we had a brilliant time using the Balance Bikes and showed some excellent perseverating, maneuvering and behaviour.

Year 1 & 2 Doves, Eagles & Falcons



Key Stage 1 have an amazing first week back and demonstrated a great effort in all of their learning. This week we have started to read our new class book 'Toys in Space' making predictions based on the evidence we have and creating diary entries for the toys that were left outside. In History, the children were excited to find out we are revisiting our learning about the great fire of London. The children have enjoyed our PE games looking at attacking and defending. Well done everyone for a fantastic week!

Year 3 & 4 Herons, Kingfishers & Owls



What a busy first week back we've had after the Easter holidays! The children arrived back well rested and with lots of lovely stories to share from their time off. We have started all of our new topics this week including a new story in English, Journey, which has really intrigued the children as it does not have words and the pictures are thought provoking. In Science we are learning about states of matter. In History we really enjoyed our first lesson learning about the Romans; where they came from and what life was like in Ancient Rome. In RE we have started learning about rules for life, thinking about the rules we live by and if they are important or not. In Art we all really enjoyed creating mood boards based on our personalities - thank you for all of the wonderful materials brought in from home - the children created amazing boards which really expressed who they are! Well done on a super week of enthusiastic learning lower key stage 2!

Year 5

What a busy first week back we've had after the Easter holidays! It has been lovely to welcome the children back into school and to listen to what they got up to over the Easter break. We have started all of our new topics this week including a new story in Whole Class Guided Reading - The Boy at the Back of the Class. We are all thoroughly enjoying this story so far. In Science, we started our new topic on forces and conducted an investigation to explore the effects of friction. In History, we were all really excited to discover that our learning is going to be all about Ancient Greece. In RE, we have started learning about how the news of Jesus' resurrection spread around the world. Well done on a fabulous first week back, Year 5!

Year 6

It has been lovely to welcome year 6 back into school for their final term in primary school this week. The children have enjoyed our new class novel - The Explorer by Katherine Rundell and created some super non-chronological reports all about the Amazon rainforest. We have also started our writing unit which is based on the book 'Manfish' by Jennifer Berne. The children created a descriptive account of a deep sea dive using lots of powerful vocabulary. In RE, our unit of work considers the importance of Ascension and Pentecost to Christians which has provoked some deep thinking. Well done year 6 - a great start to the summer term !
