Weekly Highlights

Nursery & Reception Little Lennies' & Blackbirds





We have been developing our awareness of our wonderful world this week in early years. In Nursery the children have read the story of 'A Seed in Need' which has led to us scattering wildflowers in our woods. We have also planted sunflower seeds and cannot wait to see how tall they will grow! We have discussed the changing seasons and shown our developing knowledge by creating trees from all times during the year. In Reception the children have listened carefully to the story of 'The Secret Sky Garden' and built on their prior knowledge of environments and the impact we can have on our world. The children have planted herbs for our outside classroom, created their own maps as well as completing some diary writing. In the woodlands the children have created cityscapes or famous landmarks using natural treasures found outdoors - we were very creative! What a brilliant week, well done everyone!

Year 1 & 2 Doves, Eagles & Falcons







Key Stage 1 have had a brilliant week exploring their curiosity and building on their learning. This week in English the children have been creating and describing their own alien toy with fantastic imagination and presentation skills. In History, the children were able to recall the significant causes and effects from the Great Fire of London. They loved drawing their own maps to show the fire and applied a key with significant place names. The children have enjoyed our PE games looking at attaching and defending again, showing a true love for games. Year 2 have adored spending their lunch time playtime out on the KS2 playground with the older children to help get them ready for Year 3. Well done everyone for a fantastic week!

Year 3 & 4 Herons, Kingfishers & Owls







We have had another busy week back at school! We have been writing some amazing expanded noun phrases in English to describe the beautiful pictures in our book 'Journey.' In Science we have enjoyed learning more about states of matter - learning the different properties of gases, liquids and solids. In History we are really enjoying our topic on the Romans, learning all about life in Rome and how it was different to that in Britain. In Art we have been practicing weaving using paper and have created amazing pieces! In French we are learning all about the seasons. In RE we had some thoughtful responses to our topic on rules for life and why we have them, and we focussed on the story of Moses to help us with this. We are also really enjoying reading more of 'The Butterfly Lion' in Guided Reading and have answered questions well relating to it. Well done on lots of hard work this week Lower Key Stage 2.

Year 6 have been working their socks off this week as we begin our preparation for SATs. We have gone through some practice papers in the school hall to get a feel for the room ready for when we take the real papers in a couple of weeks time. The children have continued to enjoy our class novel The Explorer and have produced some super writing based on the adventures of the children in the book. We have also continued with our work on Jacques Cousteau and the book 'Manfish' which has opened the children's eyes to the world underwater. The children are learning all about Ascension and Pentecost in RE and are enjoying our new Good News Bibles. The week was rounded off with competitive games in sports some of our Year 6s are very competitive indeed! A super week - well done Year 6!
